

Road and Speed Issues Llangoedmor Community Council

Llangoedmor Community Council has identified the following issues, some of which have been ongoing for some considerable time. While Community Council notes the various responses and indeed appreciates some of the issues highlighted in the responses it is still concerned with regard to speed and signage in the areas identified. The Council has a duty to its residents to continue to highlight and pursue matters of concern.

It has therefore created a document compiling the most significant areas of concern to ensure that they are highlighted for potential funding should such become available.

The Community Council has no suggest resolutions to some of the matters identified, as there may be highway legislation which may more easily assist the said resolution than the Council is aware of.

1. A484 by Llechryd School

CC C Davies advised that the introduction of a 20mph limit outside Llechryd School would cost in the region of £70k and County did not currently have that funding available. The average speed was 27mph and mechanical means of reducing speed would be required to create a 'zone', hence the high costs.

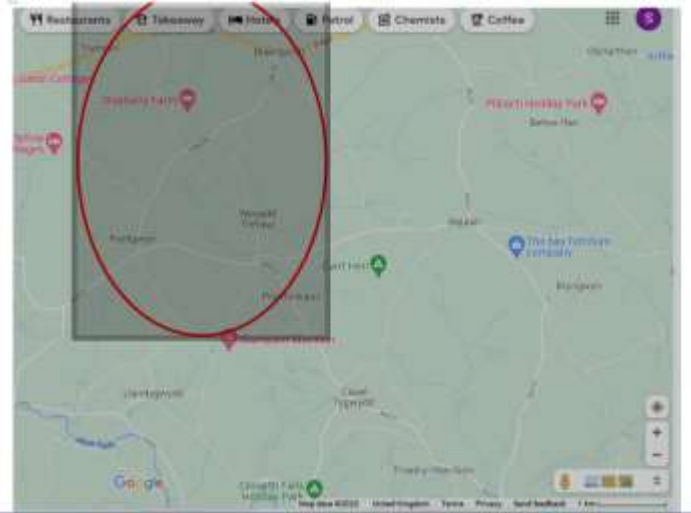
Route used as a cut through with significant speeds

7. Croes-y-Llan

<i>Identified issues</i>
Speed on A484 at crossroads.
Speed on A484 between Priory Bridge roundabout and Llechryd
No speed limit on roads leading from crossroads
Llangoedmor village (currently 60mph) no warning signs on the lanes leading into the village between the A484 and B4570 especially on the 90 degree blind bend by Old School House.
Speed on Coedmor Lane
Lack of a defined bus stop at Croes Y Llan a pick up/ drop off point for service buses 460 and school buses
No signs on the A484 approaching Llangoedmor from the Cardigan direction ie eastbound for either Llangoedmor or Croes Y Llan , they are in place approaching the village from Llechryd.
A Llangoedmor nameplate and a Croes Y Llan are also need on the A484 approaching the village from Cardigan. Nameplates are in place on the approach from Llechryd

Dear Councillor Davies
In reply to your email received on 6 September 2021, I can inform you of the following.
The Authority has no recent traffic speed data for the A484 at this location. We routinely receive many requests to deploy traffic counters, including from the police, and were we to grant them, there would be little left of the annual budget allocated to Traffic Section, and little else staff time for other matters. There would seem to be simply insufficient justification at present for considering any measures here at present. I understand that additional works to signage and road markings are due to be undertaken this financial year. I am sorry it would seem that I cannot be any more helpful than this
