

10.2.3 Installation of gates

1. Gate from Maes y Deri

Even if a self-closing gate were to be installed small to medium-sized dogs would be able to get under the gates. It would require leveling of the tarmac road in that area to prevent this.

Standing in the field looking to the rear of the hall

2. Gate to left

The post and rail fencing does have wire along its length but there is sufficient space for small to medium sized dogs to go under the rails and wire. Would need the permission of the owner of the fence (do not think it is the Council although that should be clarified in due course, may be the Hall or adjacent landowner?) to do work to prevent this. Would also need the permission of the Hall Committee to place a gate either on their wall or closing onto their wall.

3. Gate to right hand side

Steve was present when I visited the field and he pointed out that in order to install a gate in the gitty (owned by the hall), the bank would have to be dug out and a retaining wall of some kind erected.

All options obviously include costs over and above the costs of a gate and installation. Therefore will bring back to Council for discussion.
